Read: Luke 24 verses 28 - 35


After spending hours on the jigsaw puzzle, the whole picture comes together. Just one last piece to add and then - hooray! - the puzzle is complete.

Day 25) The Good House



On the T.V. news, we watched as a house in a flooded area fell into the water. The house was built on a river bank and had poor foundations (the part under the earth). Today, when a new house is built it has proper foundations made with concrete, which is as hard as rock.

In Jesus's day men had to dig out the foundations using a spade. Jesus tells a story about two men who each built themselves a house. Mr Wise Man dug deep and built on the rock but Mr Foolish Man built his house on the sand.

There was a stream near to where the houses were built. One day, gale force winds blew against the houses and the water in the stream rose until the stream burst its banks. Mr Wise Man's house stood firm on the rock. Mr Foolish Man's house fell because the sand foundations washed away and the walls collapsed.

Jesus said this story is a picture of what people do when they hear His words. A wise person not only hears what Jesus says: he does what Jesus says. A foolish person hears, but does nothing about it.

Difficulties, like storms in the story, come into everyone's life. If we have built our life on the Lord Jesus, we shall be kept safe.

Key verse

Jesus said "Whoever ... hears My sayings and does them ... is like a man building a house ...on the rock". V47-48

Read: Genesis 25 v 24-28




Some twins are identical and may look almost exactly alike. Other twins can be completely different.

Esau and Jacob were totally different. Even when the twins were born they did not look alike. Esau had a rough hairy skin but Jacob's was soft and smooth.

Not only did the twins look different but as they grew up, their interests were different. Esau liked to be out and about. As he grew older, he became a hunter of wild animals. Jacob was a 'home lover'. He preferred to stay around the tents where they lived. He probably looked after animals in pens close by.

However, there was an even more important difference between the lads - what they were like inside. Esau did not care about God, but Jacob wanted to love God.
